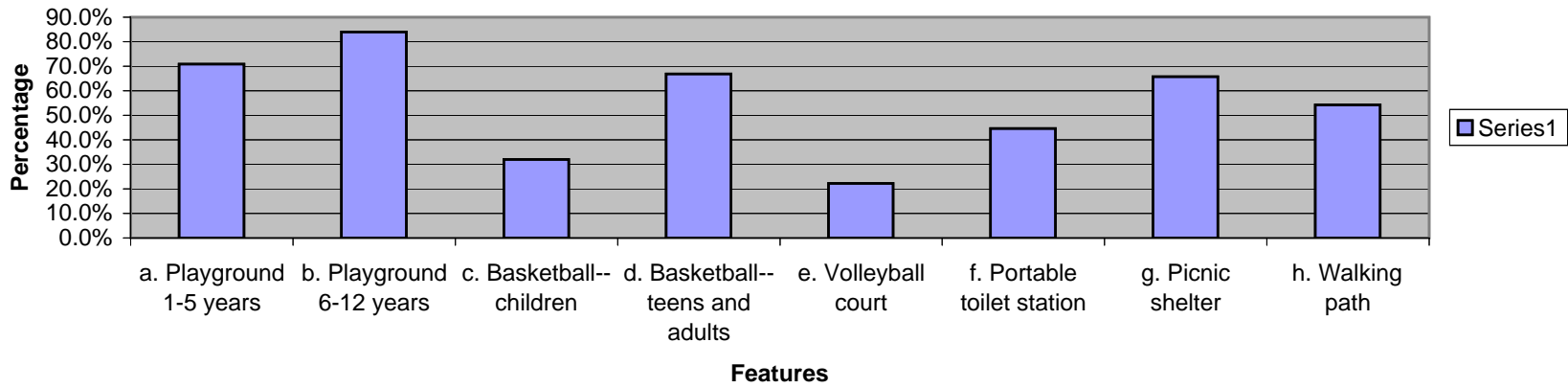

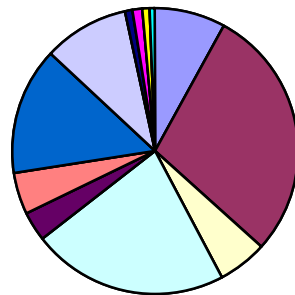

Concerns:

- f. Picnic shelter takes up too much room
- g. Space for dogs
- h. Lack of parking
- i. Sand volleyball court will become a place for cat feces and sharp objects (2)
- j. Safety and vandalism
- k. Cleanliness of park
- l. park may become a place for "hoodlums"
- m. There are a lot of children in the neighborhood
